Switch Tower Opening

The Chippewa Valley Railroad (CVRR) will kick-off this summer's Carson Park Experience with a **grand opening of the newly restored Eau Claire Switch Tower**. Tours of the Switch Tower will be led by members of the Chippewa Valley Railroad. Enjoy complementary experiences throughout the park - Admission applies for Train rides and Museum Exhibits.

<u>History of the Switch Tower</u>: The interlocking tower located on the Omaha Railroad near Banbury Place was built October 18, 1896. It became the last "depot" in Eau Claire after the Omaha Depot was demolished in 1987. The Chicago and Northwestern Railroad donated the tower to the Chippewa Valley Railroad in 1991.

P.P.S. June 4th is the anniversary of the 1958 Colfax Tornado. In the most recent <u>#ChippewaValleyHistory</u> post, CVM Archivist Jodi Kiffmeyer shared some history one of the most destructive tornadoes in Wisconsin history.

"This weekend marks the 64th anniversary of a group of tornadoes that tore through Northwestern Wisconsin on June 4, 1958. The worst damage happened in and near Colfax, where a pair of F5 funnels killed at least 20 people and injured dozens more.

Because of downed power and telephone lines, a police radio was the only communication in and out of Colfax immediately after the catastrophe. However, word soon got out, and help started pouring in. Police from as far away as Richland County, Wisconsin, came to the area, as well as medical personnel from the Twin Cities. WCCO radio out of Minneapolis put out a call to its listeners, and within a day five semi trucks were en route to Dunn County, carrying 50 tons of food and clothing.

By the end of the outbreak, at least 28 people had died and 130 were seriously injured. Several of the deaths occurred in Eau Claire and Chippewa Counties. The storms spawned 8 tornados, causing \$83 million in property damage (almost \$806 million in 2021). They were the second-most deadly tornadoes in Wisconsin history, after the 1899 New Richmond tornado that killed 117."
